

SUMMER (FREE) FOOD PROGRAM



The East Irondequoit School Nutrition Program is participating in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Summer Food Service Program, which provides [free meals to students during the summer](#). All kids in the community, 18 years and younger, can participate; you need not be an East Irondequoit resident.

When: Dates and times for Breakfast & Lunch vary by location. Please look for details on District Website in June.

Where:

- > Ivan Green School will be an OPEN SITE with Walk-in's welcome. (Also housing the Irondequoit Summer Playground program)
- > Eastridge High School and East Irondequoit Middle School will be an OPEN SITE with Walk-in's welcome
- > Helendale Road School will be a CLOSED SITE with meals available to Program ONLY students. **No Walk-in's.** (Also housing Irondequoit Summer Playground program)
- > Laurelton-Pardee and Durand-Eastman Schools will be closed due to construction. Look for us next year at one or both of these locations.
(look for, and enter by, the 'Kids Eat Free Here' flag)

How much: Free for Children 18 years old and younger.

What's on the menu: Menus will be posted on the district's Website.

- ➔ There are no income requirements and no registration is necessary, but meals must be eaten on site.
- ➔ Parents and guardians can also purchase a meal. Breakfast is \$2.50 and Lunch is \$4.10
- ➔ This program is fully funded by the USDA, so there is no cost to the district or taxpayers.
