

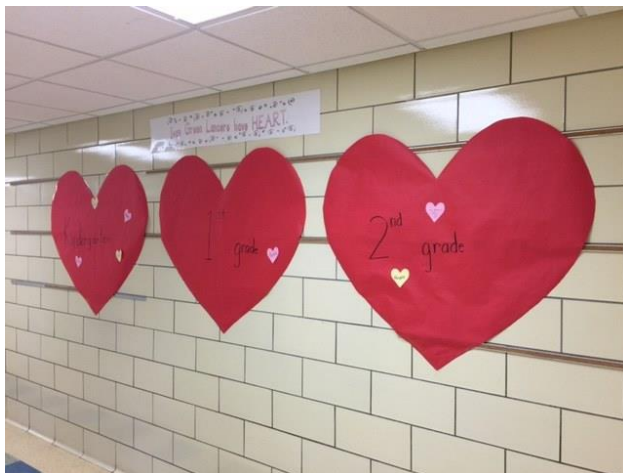

## Ivan Green has HEART!



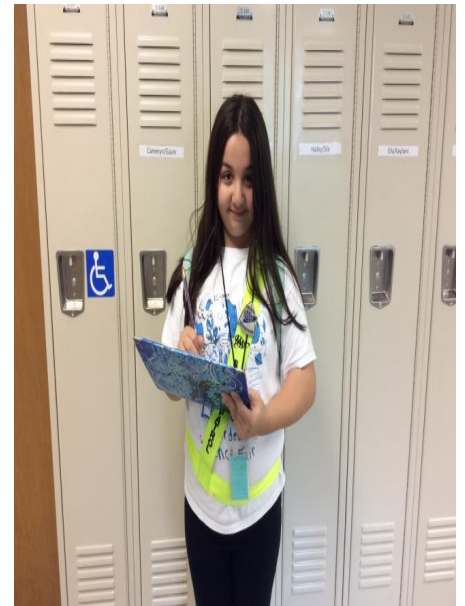

On October 1st, 20 5th graders at Laurelton-Pardee were inducted into the 2017-18 School Safety Patrol by a member of the Irondequoit Police Department. Safety Patrol members can be seen “posted” in various areas of Laurelton-Pardee in the mornings and afternoons. As a primarily student driven group, patrol members help to make sure that all students are showing HEART and are being safe and respectful members of the L-P community. The Captain of Safety Patrol is Sila Kahya, a 5th grader from Mr. Spadoni’s class (pictured on far right). Her role is to oversee all students in Safety Patrol to make sure that everyone is at their assigned post. When asked why she wanted to become a Safety Patrol Member, Sila says, “I want to help keep our school safe.” She went on to say that as a 4th grader she felt inspired by watching other students become safeties. She also feels that being a safety and showing HEART go hand in hand, “Being a safety means showing HEART everywhere!”

In addition to helping students at arrival and dismissal, Safety Patrol members will periodically visit classrooms to present “Safety Boosters” to their peers. Safeties also provide support on buses where showing HEART is of the utmost importance!
